
"eco together" - Planet Earth Grand Prix: "Buuat Pa" - The Buddhist ritual to conserve forest Kodchapan Malisorn (14)

5. Traffic Advisory for Term 3

Please take note of the following traffic matters. Your cooperation and consideration will help to make arrival and dismissal safe and smooth for all.


5.1 Students Walking to School

Students coming from the direction of the MRT station or Dunearn Road should enter the school by Gate 2A. From Gate 2A, students can access the hall and classrooms via the sheltered walkway and link bridge without crossing any roads.

5.2 Drop-off & Pick-Up by Private Cars

Students can alight along the whole stretch from the canteen to the basketball court. This stretch can accommodate at least 10 cars at any one point, when parents drive forward as far as possible. Students can also alight at Car Park C (see map below) and use the link bridge to access the hall and classrooms directly. Please ensure that your child/ward is ready to alight promptly when your car stops. Parents should not disembark from the car.

Cars are allowed into the school for pick-ups at 1.40pm after the school buses leave. Cars are not allowed to wait outside the school before 1.35pm. Please do not come too early and note that partial one-way traffic along Hillcrest Road operates from 1.00pm - 2.00pm and 4.30pm - 5.30 pm for CCAs. For school dismissal pick-ups, P1 to P4 parents should drive to the canteen pick-up point, while P5 and P6 parents should drive to the basketball court where the students gather to wait.



5.3 Indiscriminate Parking

Please do not park your cars indiscriminately along Hillcrest Road and Watten Rise during school dismissal. Indiscriminate parking makes traffic impassable and has resulted in a few near misses. LTA deploys officers to carry out ground enforcement of traffic rules and will issue summons to drivers who infringe the rules. Please refer to the attached advisory notice from LTA for more information.

6. Road Safety at RGPS

Raffles Girls' Primary School, the Land Transport Authority, Bukit Timah Citizens' Consultative Committee and Watten Residents' Network have worked together to launch three safety standees around RGPS to remind our road users to practise good driving habits and be safe road users. This will complement the "Be Kind, Drive Safe" initiative and aims to make the roads in our estate safer for our students, parents, residents and other road users. The standees were unveiled on 2 July at a simple launch. When driving on the roads around the school, please look out for the safety standees and heed the safety messages.







7. Installation of iJooz Vending Machine

In an effort to offer our students a wider variety of food and beverage choices, an iJooz vending machine has been brought into the school canteen.

Should your child/ward wish to purchase a cup of freshly squeezed orange juice, please note that the iJooz vending machine does not accept the POSB Smart Buddy as a mode of payment. Drinks may be purchased using cash, EZpay, NETS or NETS Flashpay.

A gentle reminder that all food and drinks, especially sweetened drinks, should be consumed in the school canteen and not brought up to classrooms.

8. P1 Registration (Phase 1)

Phase 1 registration is for a Singapore Citizen (SC) or Permanent Resident (PR) child born between 2 January 2018 and 1 January 2019 (both dates inclusive) and has a sibling currently studying in our school.

Parents who are registering their younger child under Phase 1 are to register before 4 July 2024, 4.30pm.

More updates on the 2024 P1 Exercise will be provided on the MOE P1 website.

9. Primary 5 National Education (NE) Show 2024

- 1. Since 1997, the National Education (NE) Show has been organised to instill a sense of pride and belonging in our students and to bring across the significance of our National Day. Every year, the National Day Parade (NDP) full dress rehearsal provides an opportunity for the organiser to inculcate NE values into our students.
- 2. This year, Singapore celebrates her 59th birthday. The theme for NDP 2024 is 'Together, As One United People', which aims to underscore the collective strength of Singaporeans and rally citizens to shape its future.
- 3. The NDP 2024 organisers have assigned our students to attend the NE Show at the Padang on Saturday, 13 July 2024. Students are to assemble in the school hall by 2.45pm, in their P5 Camp T-shirt, school pinafore and school shoes. Please ensure that your child/ward has taken her lunch before she reports to school. Students are advised to bring only a small bag with packed food, water bottle, raincoat/poncho, a recycled plastic bag to be used to contain the bento meal set, as well as to be used as a trash bag, cap, etc. (please find attached a suggested packing list). The estimated time of arrival at school after the NE Show is from 10.00pm onwards.
- 4. Please pack snacks which are easy for consumption for your child/ward to bring along to the Padang. Do not pack food which is soup-based. The school will provide a bento meal set and a can of water (300ml) for the girls at the Padang. Please pack separate food for your child/ward if she has any dietary restrictions. After eating, she will throw the empty bento box into her plastic bag.
- 5. Various measures are put in place to facilitate the arrival and departure of schools during the show. This includes the management of a centralised bus transport "taxi" system for schools travelling by bus, the deployment of traffic marshals and selective road closures for ensuring a smoother flow of traffic. Hence, to ensure the speedy dispersal of students after the show, parents/guardian will not be allowed to pick up their child/ward from the Padang.
- 6. Students will be advised to give their parents/guardian a call once they have boarded the bus to return to school if they have a handphone with them. Alternatively, parents/guardian can contact the school at 6468 4377 / 9721 0694 on the night of the NE Show for any further updates.

Please advise your child/ward that students may bring their handphone for the following purposes only:

- i. Contact parents/guardian to let them know the time of arrival at school after the NE show.
- ii. Take photographs to capture memories of the event.
- iii. They are strictly not allowed to be distracted by their phones during the show/use their handphones to chat/go on any social media platforms/play games.
- iv. Students are also not allowed to post photos of one another on social media platforms during or after the NE show.

- 7. To ensure a smooth traffic flow along Hillcrest Road for the returning buses to turn into RGPS on time, we seek your co-operation not to arrive in school until you have received a call from your child/ward of her estimated time of arrival in school.
- 8. The dismissal point on the night of Saturday, 13 July, will be at the canteen pickup point. For safety reasons, students will not be allowed to wait along Hillcrest Road. Parents/Guardian who park around the school vicinity will have to enter the school to pick up their child/ward at the canteen pick-up point area.
- 9. To prevent traffic congestion and crowding outside the school gate, LTA will continue the arrangement of not allowing any vehicles to wait along Dunearn Road and Hillcrest Road ahead of time before the school gate is open. LTA will take enforcement action against vehicles found waiting/parking before the school gate opens.
- 10. The estimated dismissal time from the Padang is 8.20pm 9.00pm. The school gate will only be opened for parents/guardian to pick up their child/ward after all the buses have left the school.
- 11. We strongly encourage you to arrive at an appropriate time and should you arrive early, please wait at any nearby parking facilities before making your way down to pick up your child/ward.
- 12. Please note that ALL students will have to be fetched by a parent/guardian from RGPS on the night of the NE Show. Kindly indicate the name of the person fetching the child and his/her contact number by clicking on the link here: https://forms.gle/8UEJFn8NiwUjSYwMA.
- 13. If your child/ward is not well on the day of the NE Show, please let her rest and not participate in this event.
- 14. We strongly encourage your child/ward to attend the NE Show as it will form part of her memorable school experiences with her peers. Kindly acknowledge receipt of this notification via Parents Gateway by 8 July 2024.
- 15. We sincerely seek your fullest co-operation in complying with our dismissal procedures on the night of 13 July 2024 to ensure the safety of all our students.

A briefing for your child/ward will be conducted in Term 3, Week 1, by her Form Teachers, to inform her of details pertaining to this event.
